	. Background: The Uthukela District Municipality is exposed to a wide range of natural and human- induced hazards that tend to cause widespread hardship and devastation to lives.	
	Natural disasters are often frightening and difficult for the communities to understand because they have no control over when they happen. Despite the natural disasters that are common phenomena in our province that can be managed and controlled, is the level of preparedness for communities and	

organs of state, as well as civil society organizations, to deal with the dangers that natural disasters bring.

The Municipal Disaster Management Unit observed that since 2014 seasonal incidents occur in their extreme and this may be attributed to the effects of climate change. Over the past few seasons, the District has experienced:

- Heavy rainfalls which caused flooding in a number of areas;
- Severe drought that causes serious shortage of water for both domestic and livestock use;
- Runaway veld fires that have ravaged the province and destroyed a lot of property, livestock, grazing lands and even claimed innocent people's lives;
- Perpetual informal settlements fires that once triggered, destroy a number of shacks at a go and leave hundreds of people displaced requiring immediate support; and
- Many other isolated fata incidents which have necessitated immediate relief to the affected communities in the misery.

The overwhelming and devastating incidents that ravaged a number of communities in our Municipality, is a clear indication that we cannot able to cope with the demands to restore life back to normal. It therefore becomes imperative that all the pillars of disaster risk management need to be planned, resourced and activated. These include prevention, mitigation, response and rehabilitation programs.



These incidents become more severe especial rural communities where poor built infrastruction mud and very old buildings collapse and are of through strong winds, heavy rains and fires. In the communities tend to lose official documents, and houses become inhabitable (displacement).

Uthukela District Municipality Disaster Management Unit as the custodian for disaster management in the municipality, is obliged to intervene in order to normalize the situation.

Rationale

This is one of the means of alleviating the pain suffered by the incumbent in line with the Disaster Management Act (57 of 2002), and section 3 (4) (g) of the Housing Act 107 of 1997 on facilitating temporary relief assistance. Disaster Management as a first responder on the scene of an emergency is required to coordinate the provision of emergency relief such as blankets, immediate shelter in a form of halls and other alternative temporary emergency structures etc.

However, it must be noted that this does not replace any other programmes of the National or Provincial Department of Housing or any other National Department. Instead, it serves to augment and supplement situations of exceptional housing emergency. This is also in line to uphold a constitutional obligation and human right principle of right to life with dignity

as also endorsed by the United Nations Charter on Humanitarian
Aid for victims in the complex emergencies.
