1. INVITATION FOR QUOTATION

UTHUKELA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY hereby, invites quotations from suitably qualified service providers for the supply, installation, testing and commissioning of a 4.8km 11KV electrical cable and all related fittings in Inkosi Langalibalele Local Municipality under the uThukela District Municipality in the KwaZulu-Natal Province.

The advertisement is only valid for seven (7) days.

The Service Providers MUST attach the following to their quotations:

- 1. Company profile.
- 2. Valid original tax clearance certificate from South African Revenue Services (SARS).
- 3. Valid (current) B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors (IRBA) or a Verification Agency accredited by South African National Accreditation System (SANAS) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporations Act (CCA) have to be submitted along with the tenders, if the Tenderer claims the preferential procurement points.
- 4. Certified ID copies of business owners.
- 5. CIDB Grading (6EB or Higher)
- 6. Local Production and Content will apply.
- 7. List of current and previous similar projects undertaken including names and contacts of the employer and project details.
- 8. Any certified copies submitted by the Service Provider must not be older than 3 months at the time of the submitting the quotes.

NB: Failure to submit all of the above attachments shall lead to the service provider being disqualified.

2. PROJECT SCOPE STATEMENT

The extent of works includes the supply, installation, testing and commissioning of a 4.8km 11KV electrical cable and all related fittings in Inkosi Langalibalele Local Municipality under the uThukela District Municipality in the KwaZulu-Natal Province.

3. PROJECT DURATION

The work is to be completed within one (1) week after date of appointment.

4. EVALUATION CRITERIA

1. Selection of suppliers will be based on the **80/20** preference point system. Indicate valid B-BBEE status on quotation. No B-BBEE status will equal zero points but not disqualification.

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2. Evidence that the service provider has the capacity to install high voltage electrical cables. This will be checked against the company profile indicating available resources and experience of the company. Minimum of 3 appointments/order required.

5. PRICING QUOTATION

1) Price needs to be provided in South African Rand (incl. VAT).

- Price should include additional cost elements such as freight, insurance until acceptance, duty where applicable, labour, excavations, electrical fittings, pipework, termination kits; all related appurtenances, fittings, construction works, and commissioning.
- 3) Payment will be according to the payment terms and conditions.

4) Payments will be made within a month of completing the works.

5) Service Providers are encouraged to have a basic knowledge of site conditions during the preparation of the quote(s).

6. BILL OF QUANTITIES

Preamble to the Bill of Quantities

- 1. The Bill comprises items covering the Service Provider's profit and costs of general liabilities and of the construction of Temporary and Permanent Works.
- 2. Although the Bidder is at liberty to insert a rate of his own choosing for each item in the Bill, he should note the fact that the Service Provider is entitled, under various circumstances, to payment for additional work carried out and that the employer is obliged to base his assessment of the rates to be paid for such additional work on the rates the Contractor inserted in the Bill.
- 3. Descriptions in the Bill of Quantities are abbreviated and may differ from those in the Standardized and Project Specifications. No consideration will be given to any claim by the Service Provider submitted on such a basis. Should any requirement of the measurement and payment clause of the appropriate Standardized or Project Specification(s) be contrary to the terms of the Bill and the specification, the specifications shall prevail.
- 4. Unless stated to the contrary, items are measured net in accordance with the specifications without any allowance having been made for waste.
- 5. The amounts and rates to be inserted in the Bill of Quantities shall be the full inclusive amounts to the Employer for the work described under the several items. Such amounts shall cover all the costs and expenses that may be required in and for the supply and delivery of goods, and shall cover the costs of all general risks, profits, taxes (but excluding value-added tax), liabilities and obligations set forth or implied in the documents on which the Bid is based.
- 6. An amount or rate shall be entered against each item in the Bill of Quantities, whether or not quantities are stated. An item against which no amount or rate is entered will be considered to be covered by the other amounts or rates in the Bill.
- 7. The Bidder shall also fill in a rate against the items where the words "rate only" appear in the amount column. Although no work is foreseen under these items and no quantities are consequently given in the quantity column, the bidded rates shall apply should work under

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these items actually be required.

- 8. Should the Bidder group a number of items together and bid one sum for such group of items, the single bidded sum shall apply to that group of items and not to each individual item, or should he indicate against any item that full compensation for such item has been included in another item, the rate for the item included in another item shall be deemed to be nil.
- 9. The bidded rates, prices and sums shall, subject only to the provisions of the Conditions of Contract, remain valid irrespective of any change in the quantities during the execution of the Contract.
- 10. The quantities of work as measured and accepted and certified for payment in accordance with the Conditions of Contract, and <u>not</u> the quantities stated in the Bill of Quantities, will be used to determine payments to the Service Provider. The validity of the Contract shall in no way be affected by differences between the quantities in the Bill of Quantities and the quantities certified for payment.
- 11. For the purposes of this Bill of Quantities, the following words shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:
 - Unit: The unit of measurement for each item of work as defined in the Standardized,
 Project or Particular Specifications
 - Quantity: The number of units of work for each item
 - Rate: The payment per unit of work at which the Bidder bids to do the work
 - Amount: The quantity of an item multiplied by the bidded rate of the (same) item
 - Sum: An amount bidded for an item, the extent of which is described in the Bill of
 Quantities, the Specifications or elsewhere, but of which the quantity of work is not
 measured in units

TAX CLEARANCE CERTFICATE REQUIREMENTS

It is a condition of bid that the taxes of the successful bidder <u>must</u> be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the bidder's tax obligations.

- 2.2 **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad -Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3 **"B-BBEE status level of contributor"** means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic

Empowerment Act;

- "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less.
- 2.10 "Firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 "sub-contract" means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract:
- 2.16 "total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 **"trustee"** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

80/20 or 90/10

5. Points awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution

5.1 In terms of Regulation 5 (2) and 6 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval

for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level

- Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or 5.3 a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, 5.4 provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated 5.5 entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.

10. I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
